Subject: Measures to limit through traffic on residential streets in the western part of the Garden City

Dear Townies,

In 2024, the Town of Mount Royal launched a pilot project to limit through traffic on small residential streets in the western sector. Two locations were selected for this purpose, and the Town proceeded to install flower planters at the following locations:

- On Graham Boulevard at the intersection of Mitchell and Hanover
- On Laird Boulevard at the intersection of Caledonia

Several comments were received, and the Town sought expert advice in 2025. A mandate was then awarded to the firm CIMA+ to validate these choices.

Upcoming Work

After reviewing the report from CIMA+, the Town decided to install flower planters at the following intersections:

- On Graham Boulevard at the intersection of Mitchell and Hanover
- On Laird Boulevard at the intersection of Caledonia
- On Graham Boulevard near Dunvegan and Winton

Additional signage and the installation of speed bumps are planned to support the project’s implementation. The installation of the flower planters is scheduled for the end of May 2026.

Monitoring will be carried out to analyze how drivers respond to these obstacles. In the fall, before the winter season, the flower planters will be removed. An analysis will assess their effectiveness, after which a recommendation will be presented to the Town council for the following season.
